**Inmate Death at FCI Seagoville**

WASHINGTON, D.C.: On Friday, July 10, 2020, inmate Joseph Robson Sr., tested positive for COVID-19 at the Federal Correctional Institution (FCI) Seagoville in Seagoville, Texas, and was immediately placed in medical isolation. On Tuesday, August 25, 2020, in accordance with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines, Mr. Robson was converted to a status of recovered following the completion of medical isolation and presenting with no symptoms.

On Tuesday, February 22, 2022, Mr. Robson was evaluated for weakness, nausea, and abdominal pain by institution medical staff and was transported to a local hospital for further evaluation and treatment. Subsequently, on Friday, March 4, 2022, Mr. Robson, who had pre-existing medical conditions which the CDC lists as risk factors for developing more severe COVID-19 disease, was pronounced deceased by hospital staff.

Mr. Robson was an 82-year-old male who was sentenced in the Northern District of Florida to a 360-month sentence for Using a Minor to Engage in Sexually Explicit Conduct for the Purpose of Producing a Visual Depiction of Such Conduct and Receipt of Child Pornography. He had been in custody at FCI Seagoville since October 1, 2018.

FCI Seagoville is a low security facility that currently houses 1,541 male offenders.
