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Inmate Death at FCI Englewood

WASHINGTON, D.C.: On Saturday, January 22, 2022, inmate Francisco Aybar was found unresponsive at the Federal Correctional Institution (FCI) Englewood in Littleton, Colorado. Responding staff immediately initiated life-saving measures. Staff requested emergency medical services (EMS) and life-saving efforts continued. Subsequently Mr. Aybar, who had long-term, pre-existing medical conditions which the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) lists as risk factors for developing more severe COVID-19 disease, was pronounced deceased by EMS staff.

Following a review of the recently received autopsy report, it was determined Mr. Aybar's death was related to COVID-19.

Mr. Aybar was an 81-year-old male who arrived at FCI Englewood on November 5, 2021, under pretrial status after being indicted for a Supervised Release Violation of Possession of Child Pornography.

FCI Englewood is a low security facility and currently houses 884 male offenders.
