Multi-Agency Task Force Operation at FCC Beaumont

WASHINGTON, D.C.: The U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) created a task force aimed at identifying and removing contraband and investigating misconduct in the Federal Correctional Complex (FCC) Beaumont, in Beaumont, Texas. The task force is led by the Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) and the Office of the Inspector General (OIG), with support from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and the U.S. Attorney's Office (USAO) for the Eastern District of Texas.

An initial operation began on March 3, 2026. During the operation, law enforcement officers identified and confiscated numerous electronic devices, drugs and associated paraphernalia, and homemade weapons. This operation was supported by law enforcement officers from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Customs and Border Protection (CBP), and local law enforcement from the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS), the Texas Department of Criminal Justice, and the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office. The operation continues the longstanding cooperation between BOP, the OIG, and other law enforcement partners to address the dangers of contraband in the federal prison system.
