Inmate Death at FCI Oakdale I

WASHINGTON, D.C.: On Tuesday, March 24, 2020, inmate Michael Lilley went into respiratory failure at the Federal Correctional Institution (FCI) Oakdale I in Oakdale, Louisiana. He was evaluated by institutional medical staff and transported to a local hospital for further treatment and evaluation. While at the local hospital, Mr. Lilley tested positive for COVID-19. On Tuesday, March 24, 2020, his condition declined and he was placed on a ventilator. On Wednesday, April 15, 2020, Mr. Lilley, who had long-term, pre-existing medical conditions which the CDC lists as risk factors for developing more severe COVID-19 disease, was pronounced dead by hospital staff.

Mr. Lilley was a 55 year-old male who was sentenced in the Western District of Tennessee to a 300-month sentence for Aiding and Abetting – Sex Trafficking of Children, Conspiracy to Commit Sex Trafficking of Children, Sexual Exploitation of a Minor, and Distribution of Child Pornography, and Possession of Child Pornography. He had been in custody at FCI Oakdale I since April 26, 2017.

FCI Oakdale I is a Low security facility that currently houses 976 male offenders.
