Update on the Scheduled Execution of – Orlando Cordia Hall

Terre Haute, Indiana: The Court Order to execute Mr. Orlando Cordia Hall has been fulfilled.

Pursuant to the sentence of the United States Court for the Northern District of Texas, Orlando Cordia Hall has been executed by lethal injection.

He was pronounced deceased at 11:47 p.m. Eastern Standard Time by the Vigo County Coroner.

Orlando Cordia Hall, 49, forcibly abducted a 16-year-old female from her apartment in Arlington, Texas, repeatedly physically and sexually assaulted her, and struck her head and shoulders approximately 15 times with a shovel before burying her in a four feet deep grave where she died. On February 12, 1996, a jury in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas sentenced Hall for being found guilty of the following offenses: Kidnapping Resulting in Death; Aiding & Abetting; Conspiracy to Commit Kidnapping; Interstate Travel in Aid of a Racketeering Enterprise & Aiding & Abetting; Using & Carrying a Firearm during and In Relation to a Crime of Violence; and Aiding & Abetting.

USP Terre Haute is a High security facility with approximately 1,270 male inmates.

It is the mission of the Federal Bureau of Prisons to protect society by confining offenders in the controlled environments of prisons and community-based facilities that are safe, humane, cost-efficient, and appropriately secure, and that provide work and other self-improvement opportunities to assist offenders in becoming law-abiding citizens.
