Update on the Scheduled Execution of – Dustin John Higgs

Terre Haute, Indiana: Today, Dustin John Higgs, 48, was executed at the U.S. Penitentiary Terre Haute in accordance with the nine capital sentences unanimously recommended by a federal jury and imposed by the U.S. District Court for the District of Maryland in 2000. Higgs was pronounced deceased at 1:23 a.m. Eastern Standard Time.

In 1996, Higgs and two friends kidnapped three women and drove them to a secluded area in the Patuxent National Wildlife Refuge in Laurel, Maryland. After ordering the women out of the vehicle, Higgs gave his gun to a friend and said, "Better make sure they're dead." The man stepped out of the vehicle and fatally shot the three women. Higgs was found guilty of three counts of first-degree premeditated murder, three counts of first-degree felony murder, and three counts of kidnapping resulting in death, and he received nine death sentences.
