Inmate Death at FMC Carswell

WASHINGTON, D.C.: On Monday, September 20, 2021, inmate Tammy J. Lamere tested positive for COVID-19 at the Federal Medical Center (FMC) Carswell in Fort Worth, Texas. Institution medical staff monitored Ms. Lamere's condition and provided treatment. On Monday, September 27, 2021, Ms. Lamere was evaluated by institution medical staff and transported to a local hospital due to developing complications related to the virus.

On Wednesday, September 29, 2021, Ms. Lamere's condition worsened and she was placed on a ventilator. On Thursday, September 30, 2021, Ms. Lamere, who had long-term, pre-existing medical conditions, which the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) lists as risk factors for developing more severe COVID-19 disease, was pronounced deceased by hospital staff.

Ms. Lamere was a 50-year-old female who was sentenced in the Northern District of New York to a 360-month sentence for Conspiracy to Sexually Exploit a Child, and Sexual Exploitation of a Child. Ms. Lamere had been in custody at FMC Carswell since October 10, 2018.

FMC Carswell is an administrative security facility that currently houses 1385 female offenders.
